

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JOURNEY OF PATHSHALA

At times we don't know how what the future holds for us, we strongly believe in an idea, have faith and we take the first step "Faith is taking"

the first step even when you don't see the whole staircase."

We wanted to do something meaningful for the underprivileged children of our society who have the zeal to excel in their lives but lack of resources and improper guidance impede their growth. These children have truckloads of talent and bountiful of skills, what they need is a little guidance and a modicum of resources to propel them on to a higher growth trajectory. Our mission was to provide them with that little succor to turn their dreams into reality.

One of our founding members, Sh. Ankur Maheshwari attended the seminar on life transformation course, and that is what spurred him to start working on his dream which was, working for weaker sections of the society.

This idea was given concrete shape in a car, yes, in a car, seeds of many great ideas were sown in garages but this idea was shaped in a car by a bunch of HP East employees while traversing through snarls of Mumbai traffic jams, from PH to HP Nagar.

Aim was to support those children who cannot not get the proper education. In our country, we have over 450 million children who are less than eighteen years of age and not all are so fortunate that they to go to school others even though

go to school but cannot afford to pay the exorbitant tuition fees which is required to be paid to excel in higher studies.

We took a leap of faith, we didn't know, how this initiative will pan out, whether we will be able to rope in the students, and even if we rope in the students, will we be able to get the quality teachers who are willing to spare their time for this cause, how will we finance this entire initiative but all these were mere roadblocks on our path.

We knew it was an arduous journey, a treacherous mountain to climb but journey to a thousand miles begins with a single step. We organized a meeting at the HPNW clubhouse with all the maids, security guards, contractors and other colony workers to understand the needs of their children. A need assessment form was also prepared to understand the needs.

It was a humble attempt by a bunch of carpool partners but we never knew it will turn out to be a collective attempt of all our HPNW employees. Once we had a fair idea, how to start the things we sought contribution from our employees and their

spouses, and our entire HP family was magnanimous to wholeheartedly respond our endeavor. We did not want to get lost in the labyrinth of the education business and wanted to have a clear path.

Every day brought in a new opportunity and new sets of challenges, but we were gaining from strength to strength as students started coming to our classes. Teachers were working doubly as hard, working in their offices as well as teaching the children who enrolled for these classes. We were really ecstatic that our venture was taking the shape we so desired

Now we needed a vision statement to guide us and all the volunteers and founders decided to co create a vision statement which shall be our guiding light. Our vision statement is:

PATHSHALA is a community-centric, sustainable and progressive Pan India Platform that reaches students from the needy section of society to develop their potential through quality education and life skills, thereby delivering happiness.

PATHSHALA is a team of self-motivated and committed volunteers who work in synergy for inclusive growth of society with a collective sense of pride.

PATHSHALA is transforming the young generation into socially responsible citizens by facilitating their holistic growth.





Circa March, 2020 and CVOID 19 struck us. Life in all walks was disrupted and pathshala too was not left untouched. It was no longer possible for us to hold classes physically and we were in quandary, as students in Pathshala are from the unprivileged part of our society, most of them did not have smartphones (even the basic smartphones) to attend online classes. In some cases, the family had one smartphone, which couldn't be made available exclusively for the kid to attend online classes. Also, recharging data packs for online classes regularly was not a priority for a family that was struggling to make both ends meet, when their earnings had almost vanished due to lockdown. Further, they had very little exposure to the handling of technology.

But every cloud has a silver lining, we turned this crisis into an opportunity and started with online classes and as it is said that you want something dearly entire universe conspires in helping you achieve it.

Our HP family came to our rescue in this time of crisis and contributed to the cause of e pathshala. We were able to raise Rs.1.4 lakhs within 24 hours. This enabled us to purchase smartphones/tablets for 16 needy kids so that they can continue their online classes without any break. No words can be enough to thank our HP Pariwar for their generosity. We would also like to thank Shakti Club for donating Rs. 20,000/- for digitalisation of HP PATHSHALA

We distributed sixteen mobile phones to the children who were in dire need of the resources. Bolstered by this initiative and interest shown by our volunteer teachers who themselves were not aware of online teaching got into the midst of fight and started taking classes online. They had to train themselves to take the classes and how to use VC applications like zoom, Webex etc. but they all took to it as fish to water and we had our pathshala up and running with a e added to it. Now it was epathshala.

At e pathshala we don't just focus on academics but on life skills as well. We are structuring our epathshala to help children scale the newer heights and be prepared to achieve the desired results and become a better human being.

Our vision statement is our guiding light and our aim is for holistic development of children and not just rot learning, in line with our vision statement, we are planning for debates, elocution and dramatics competition for our children we will also continue to organize career counseling sessions, IT skills enhancement sessions, memory improvement classes and above all we want to instill socially responsible moral values in these children so that they



become socially responsible citizens who serve the nation in years to come. Also these skills will make them standout in this ever changing and rapidly evolving world.

Vision statement succinctly enunciated the path we had to chart and we achieved various milestones in our path: List of various milestones is as below:

WHAT DO THEY THINK!



Taking feedback of students, their parents and volunteers is a part of journey of Pathshala,

its part of how it helped us grow and slowly mature. Students are lifeline of Pathshala, they have braced our volunteers and have come a long way with us, fighting various challenges and supporting us in our shortcomings. After completing almost four years of Pathshala, we conducted a Google survey from over 60 current students of Pathshala, which we called "We want to know you more!". In this, we asked students various questions related to their experiences with Pathshala.

We have students from around 29 different schools and colleges, studying in class 8th to 12th and it is our pleasure







to share the excerpt of survey with you. There are over 6 students who are in Pathshala since inception, this is in-spite of discontinuance of class 7th after lockdown.

Next was about their favourite subjects and we found, just like the time when we were kids. Maths and science holds a

place in every child's heart, 39% students exclaimed Maths as their most loved subject with Science and English following up 22.6% and 16.1% respectively. The interesting contradiction in the survey came out to be when asked about most difficult subject, science and Maths again got the 1st and 2nd place closely followed by English subject, giving students tough times in school.


The paramount thing here was to know about what do the students think about the difference they observe in themselves



after joining Pathshala. Survey result said, - 78% of students have observed either 'increase in confidence' or 'started dreaming to become something in future by studying'. Remaining 14% students started liking studies which is a positive sign.


On asking about effect on their grades, survey results made us happy as according to 82.3% students their grades have improved, rest 17.7% students are not sure about it.

Have your grades improved after joining Pathshala 62 responses




Students were open about telling about whether they understand what is taught being in class, though 67.7% students said they always understand, 21% students mostly understand, while almost 11.3% students needs more attention.

Are you able to understand what teachers teach you in Pathshala? 62 responses




Remembering our teachers from our school, teachers love and care meant equal to parents love. Knowing from survey, all students feel cared for, is a thing that all volunteers should be proud of.

The children are always very excited to attend Pathshala because it is an environment of fun, learning and helping.

It used to be an opportunity to meet younger ones and interact with them. Interaction with kids provided lot of insights into a society where getting good education is a privilege. The struggle of the kids & their parents to keep balance between earning

for their daily needs and education is inspiring. Enthusiasm and sincerity of the kids at HP Pathshala are commendable. When we used to be kid, we would like to spend our Sunday morning time at home watching weekly TV shows or play with our friends. Here, kids are coming on Sundays for study and more importantly, with smile on their faces. Such a sincerity and excitement of the kids are encouraging and providing satisfaction.

At HP Pathshala, our efforts are on study as well as imparting life skills to the kids. Other than subjects, we interact with kids on the various topics which provide them an understanding about practical uses of the things. 

how to achieve better outcomes in society. They are defining clear goals, selecting the right grantees, and measuring progress with a sustainable approach. They are deploying majority of their resources on deep-rooted social challenges in high-need areas.

Philanthropic initiative may be defined as a social change effort that is organized around clear developmental needs and goals, seeks to affect a specific population or field, and operates within a defined time horizon. Philanthropy can play several unique roles as detailed below, in catalyzing Social changes.

- 1. Build innovative solutions- This type of giving seeks to disrupt status quo approaches in order to develop novel initiatives, and demonstrate potential for impact at scale.
- 2. Scale proven solutions-Here, one need

to identify existing interventions that are working, and extend their impact to new geographic areas or target groups.

- 3. Support community driven development- This involves collectively working on a social problem from the bottom up, and thoroughly understanding a community's needs.
- 4. Strengthen/ reform systems- This seeks to bring about Long lasting change by influencing the underlying structures, relationships, or beliefs that characterize a social ecosystem.
- 5. Build a field- This involves investing in efforts to fill a gap, or bringing together stakeholders pursuing the same problem.
- Inform public policy- These types of efforts provide focus on shaping legislative, administrative, and judicial reforms.

When we dig a little deeper, three approaches consistently emerge as key

to catalyze Social change and amplify our initiative's impact: Collaborate, Course Correct, and Change Behaviors. Indeed, these three dimensions are all hallmarks of successful social change initiatives.

- Collaborate Strategically with Patners across the ecosystem that have Complementary Capabilities as It takes a diverse portfolio of skills to drive an ambitious social impact initiative.
 - Course Correct to deliver Better Results by continuously evolving our approaches as per Risks & failures and making significant design changes accordingly.
- Change the behaviors of communities and institutions, by motivating change from within, without imposing the behavior change on the community

Looking across India's social sector, it is evident that there is both the necessity and the opportunity for philanthropy to drive social change efforts.

HP PATHSHALA is another such Philanthropic initiative which started as a weekly volunteering program by few HP colony residents to teach children of domestic helpers, security guards, support staff and other such needy children of nearby slums and has now transformed into full-fledged daily after-school classroom teaching.

We are having team of 50 plus volunteers @ HP Pathshala, who all are Philanthropists, working collectively for betterment of society. Our approach is how to achieve better outcomes in society. We have defined clear goals, selected needy students and are progressing with a sustainable methodology.

Our Philanthropy approach involves 'Scale Proven Solutions ' as well as 'Support community driven development' roles. We are extending our initiative into new geographic frontiers or target groups. (PAN Maharashtra) and also empowering community to lead. Our students are our brand ambassadors.

To catalyze Social change and amplify our initiative's impact, We have collaborated with Pillai College of Education. We transformed/evolved from Classroom teaching to Online Teaching successfully and changing the behaviors of communities and target sector, by motivating change from within.


