In today's world, we are ALWAYS VERY BUSY. Right from our daily workout schedule, to office, to our kids' studies, to fulfilling other families' responsibilities, we are VERY BUSY AND OCCUPIED. We all come from varied backgrounds, overcoming various challenges to reach where we are. We are overwhelmed with our own struggles in life and how we always put in more efforts to achieve success then those so called born with "A SILVER SPOON". In the process, we seldom spare a thought for those who may need our help to overcome their struggles.

In a city like Mumbai, allocating time for any noble cause is considered possible only for ELITE CLASS or for those who have dedicated their life to a particular cause. Definitely, something not for people like us to incorporate in our daily routine.

Our lives were NO DIFFERENT except for the thought that was always there at the back of our mind of HOW WE CAN GIVE BACK TO THE SOCIETY. Finally, we (Ankur & Rupali Maheshwari, Yogesh Gupta and Shabbir Azam) decided to take the plunge and started exploring various possibilities on what we can do for them during weekend. Initially, we thought to start working on Financial Planning for our colony workers, security guards, housekeeping staff etc. who are indirectly part of our lives. But some domestic maids showed their concern about their kids' poor marks and their helplessness to alter this situation even after paying for tuitions. This struck hard to us and we thought to do something in this direction for all of them.

Genesis of Pathshala

BEGINNING OR THE FIRST BABY STEP

We discussed our intentions with other car pool partners and finally we came out with an idea to work on conceptual knowledge and career guidance of such kids through weekly tuition classes. After discussing it with all, we created a Whatsapp group with name "**Team PATHSHALA**" on 13th October 2017.

After getting permission from HP Nagar administration to go ahead for this social cause, finally a meeting was planned on 18th November 2017 with all the maids, security guards, contractors and other colony workers to understand their need. We also prepared a "Need assessment form" to understand the needs and concern of the parents, to be distributed after our meeting.

When our workers were asked to gather in HPNW clubhouse for the meeting, they were not able to believe that this meeting is planned for them. The meeting was attended by 20-25 workers who agreed that their kids faced difficulty in understanding English and Maths and the elder kids also needed career counselling. They were asked to fill the form for the kids containing their basic details, class, medium of education and subjects and to submit the form in weeks' time. They were also asked to inform their co-workers about this initiative and ask them to send their kids too.

In the meantime, we circulated email to all the officials/residents staying in HPNW and also started talking personally to all our friends and neighbours to get them on board for teaching these kids. We believed that we can build a big resource pool from amongst our colleagues, their spouses, teenage kids and even retired parents who all are very well qualified and have willingness to contribute. Through this email circulation in HPNW colony, we got many volunteers specially Mohammed Usman Khan who laid the foundation of PATHSHALA with us..

FIRST MILESTONE AND THE CHALLENGES IT BROUGHT

Our anxious wait was over when we got to conduct our first class on 9_{th} December 2017 in the clubhouse of HP Nagar West. We had received form from 20-25 kids and so were expecting a full house. The reality was quite different as our team of 6 volunteers on first day had only 6 kids to teach in total.



Our 1st Challenge - Though the children needed PATHSHALA, lot of efforts and motivation were required to make kids come for some sort of classes on a weekend- a time they were used to for sleeping or playing.

Another challenge was that each kid had a different level of understanding irrespective of his class. This clubbed with Marathi or Hindi as the medium of education required us to have volunteers in team who can teach in Marathi/Hindi medium.

We first chose to incentivise the kids to come. Along with concept building, each session had its special dose of moral & inspirational stories to teach them basic day to day etiquettes, to extempore to games and GK quizzes taken by **Mrs. Rupali Maheshwari**. We tried to inculcate all round growth along with positive thinking and good manners through these activities. Not to forget the prizes to the winners and snacks for all to motivate them to actively participate and also to come regularly.

Students started increasing slowly and so did our team size and motivation. Our team of volunteers grew from 6 to 20 till Dec end. We had conducted 6 classes successfully with 13-14 kids registering for weekly classes. We had also made a small kitty of funds from our mutual contribution for buying stationary for kids.



The initial phase was difficult as the volunteers needed to be retained in order to keep the purpose alive even when the number of kids was very less. We were very fortunate to have likes of **Mr. Sudhir Kashyap**, **Mr. Ajay Vaja**, **Mrs. Nidhi Gupta** and **Mr. Tejpal Singh Chundawat** to educate these kids. Even kids like **Maithali** (daughter of Ankur n Rupali Maheshwari), Mrs. Sameeksha Jain's Kids- Vidhi and Shashwat, Mrs. Sharda Turkar kids-**Pari and Sparsh** also joined us in managing and teaching these kids. A morale boost we had not envisaged.

THE JOURNEY STARTED AND THE CARAVAN BEGAN TO GROW

With the dawn of new year 2018, we started approaching adjacent buildings like Mamta Heights and Sai Arpan to get more such students as the regularity of the kids of our colony workers was very poor. We believed that kids will come only if their parents are convinced with the cause and the benefits it contained for their kids and their future. In this endeavour we approached nearby Govt. school (where kids of all the nearby slums went) to spread awareness of our cause and after multiple meetings we could succeed in convincing the principal to allow to address the parents in school's Parents Teachers Meeting which was handled very effectively by **Mrs**. **Sameeksha Jain**. Finally, the school allotted us their identified 20 weakest students of class 5-8 and requested us to move them forward. We accepted the challenge and two of our lady volunteers – **Mrs**. **Sharda Turkar** and **Mrs**. **Sonal Jadhav** (who had prior teaching background) took classes for these students in the school – alternate days of the week after school hours.

We had around 15 kids coming for us on a regular basis. However, we felt that still our cause is not being able to reach its target segment. So, we decided to visit nearby slums where these people resided and not the colonies where they worked. Usmanji and Ankur, went to slums like Sai Nagar and Shri Ganesh Patel Nagar on 10th Feb 2018 to understand the needs and concerns of the parents and their kids. Parents gave us the feedback that kids don't want to study on weekend but could come for something interesting besides study. Keeping this in mind and to incentivise students to keep coming regularly, we decided to regularly conduct GK Quizzes, some educative games and celebrate birthdays of kids. We also got permission from HPCL authorities to allow the kids to enter through colony's back gate, facing Sai Apran, for few days, with our volunteers escorting the students.



Our efforts were rewarded, and we had full class, with more than 25 regular students from 11th Feb 2018 and we had to divide them in TT Room and Changing Room. The children were also provided with snacks sponsored by some or the other volunteer for each class. Even our kids helped us in teaching and managing these kids which was a great learning experience for our kids also. Sai Nagar students were the students with no resource to go for tuitions and they readily agreed to come to our classes. Patel Nagar was better off and they wanted daily classes instead of weekly classes for them to decide to leave their tuitions.

Though we had around 20 team volunteers, we had started facing issue of ACTIVE VOLUNTEERISM. After one or two class, the satisfaction of doing social service was getting fulfilled and a few of our volunteers started finding excuses to miss the class. In order to keep the morale high and volunteers interested, we graduated to monthly calendar and started dividing the team into two parts - Organizing team and teaching team. **Mr. Usman Khan** and **Dr. R. N Gupta Uncle** were made teaching leads to ensure availability of room, teaching volunteers and coordinate on quality of teaching. With growing number of students, we had started facing space crunch (also the club house was frequently booked for other colony activities) and so we submitted a proposal to ED-HR, for allotment of a permanent place for PATHSHALA. We also got our first pamphlet published through *Corporate Affairs Department*.



One of our aims for setting up PATHSHALA was to also sow the seed of contribution to society in our own kids as well as among the GENNEXT of our colony. Our wishes were fulfilled, when two of the most popular youngsters of our colony among kids- **Mr. Rohan Sapra** and **Miss Ria Sapra** joined us. Being college going students, doing their engineering, they were able to easily connect with PATHSHALA kids and made learning easy for them. They became our big assets with their flexibility to look after any class they were asked to teach.

NEW SESSION, A LOT OF FIRSTS AND EVEN BIGGER CHALLENGES

Daily Classes: In order to ensure that our classes do not just remain as weekend classes and make an actual impact in the life of kids, DAILY CLASSES were the only way forward. The biggest HITCH, however was that whether we are prepared in terms of adequate volunteers and their commitment. We remember that while discussing about commencement of daily classes, our team used to get nervous with the thought of not being able to deliver on sustainability of daily classes. One of our volunteers, **Mr**. **Sanjeev Swain**, took this call and started taking daily classes. He led from the front and slowly we overcame this wave of uncertainty. In order to ensure that children are regular to classes, we introduced "Best Student of the month" and reward was exhibited before beginning of the month. Inspirational movies like "I am Kalam" and various *GK*/science quizzes and public speaking sessions were held for kids on weekends to keep them motivated to come and also enable them expand their dimensions of knowledge.

A big boost for our mission came when **Mr**, **Vineet Yadav** joined us and took upon himself the complete responsibility for 10th class. With his prior teaching experience, he soon gained the confidence of not only students but also their parents. Soon, his maths classes became a big draw for kids and students for class 10th kept growing with word of mouth. God was always on our side and **Mrs**. **Sarika Pahunikar** herself came inquiring for teaching science to PATHSHALA Kids. Her teaching style clubbed with homemade experiments made learning fun for kids and kindled in them a spark for building live models themselves.



A DREAM COME TRUE: Our team's persistence and commitment found full support from HPCL and our request for a special space for PATHSHALA was granted. We were allotted row-house D-5 for our classes and above all it was beautifully painted like schools where our kids go to. Our volunteers and above all our students were exhilarated with these excellent facilities. It was a fulfilling and proud moment for us when our PATHSHALA classes were formally inaugurated by our Director-HR, Mr. Pushp Joshi.

With the availability of four classrooms in our new premises, we were able to easily set up a time-table for all the classes. Teaching team was bifurcated into classes 5-8th and 9-10th. We were now able to focus on basics of English on a regular basis as children were struggling even in reading English properly in classes 5 and 6 also.

The problem of active volunteerism kept popping in and out. A few of our excellent teachers like **Mrs. Shipra Gupta, Mrs. Nidhi Gupta** and **Mrs. Mansi Teke** were not able to contribute regularly as they had small kids. It was then agreed that they can take the classes at their home in the afternoon after their own little kids have slept.

The scheme worked and Mrs. Shipra Gupta soon became one of the strong pillars of 9th and 10th team and Mrs. Mansi Teke and Mrs. Nidhi Gupta of class 7 and 8th team. The teachers divided the chapters of their subjects to ensure continuity of teaching in a particular style as well as share the load. The strategy worked wonders and the seed that we had sown of building on the concepts of the children begin to shoot up and blossom on its journey of becoming a tree.

A PLEASEANT SURPRISE AN UNEPXECTED GIFT ... TECHNOLOGY ENTERS PATHSHALA ...

Teaching at PATHSHALA had started with the whiteboard of Ankur's daughter. Later we graduated to white boards purchased specifically for PATHSHALA. However, our teaching team had never dreamt of getting to teach these kids through the use of latest technology. This was made possible due to our Senior Management constant support. We got one projector from our management and one projector donated by CSR team of IL&FS to PATHSHALA. It was another moment of constant blessings of almighty with us.



HPNE- PATHSHALA 2.0

Ankur, Shabbir and Sudhir had coincidentally moved to HPNE colony at around same time. With the HPNE colony being geographically situated near two slums, we had a huge opportunity available to make a difference in lot many more lives.

On 29th June 2018, a circular calling for volunteers for HPNE PATHSHALA was released by HP Nagar Housing Complex to all the residents of HPNE Colony. We started getting interest and queries from many residents about the same. Our experience of HPNW enabled us to successfully handle doubts raised on sustainability of PATHSHALA and



residents started joining our team. Initially we requested volunteers to teach in HPNW basis upon their availability, so as to get conversant about what is expected as a volunteer in PATHSHALA.

Shabbir got these posters printed which were placed at prominent places in the colony to attract attention of the colony workers. Finally, a meeting was planned on 7th July 2018 to understand the concerns of HPNE workers and make them understand our initiative. We had a successful meeting addressed by our volunteer **Mrs**. **Resmy Sibby** with more than 70 workers attending the meeting. Need Assessment Forms were distributed to them. We got an overwhelming response and received request for 43 students for attending PATHSHALA classes.

We got another dedicated volunteer **Mrs**. Lona Pandey who became instrumental in setting up of HPNE PATHSHALA along with us.

We planned an "Interactive Session" with the kids on 22nd July 2018 for understanding their need. Unfortunately, there were some communication gaps and none of the children came. It was very disheartening as HP Admin had arranged Projector, Food packets and other arrangements for the children. Our team however showed solidarity and chose to take action - instead of giving up and be disheartened, we made calls to all 43 students.



Finally, to our happiness around 31 children reported at the venue and we had a good interactive session. The children were informed to come for classes on Saturday and Sunday - both at 10-12 am in morning and 6-8 pm in evening.

Although we got interest from 20 residents but here also we faced the same issue of nonavailability of volunteers on a regular basis - essential for maintaining continuity in classes. Despite commitment for the cause, getting volunteers on holidays out of their personal engagements/family time was always a challenge. Despite these teething issues in the beginning, we had strong support of volunteers like **Mrs. Lona Pandey, Mrs. Resmy Sibbi** and **Mrs. Avika Patel** who became the pillar of HPNE PATHSHALA, ready to shoulder any responsibility, with a constant zeal to contribute.

We started using e-books for reference of teachers so that each volunteer can have a book of their own. We were initially of the view, that there will be very minimal challenges while expanding into HPNE as everything is very structured here. We soon realized we don't have the privilege of "A bed of roses" here also.

Right from dealing with inactive volunteerism to lack of availability of Marathi teachers to safe passage of kids to chummery from main gate - all were uphill tasks. Students used to get attracted after seeing such a beautiful colony, wanted to play in playground, go to Clubhouse etc. To circumvent this, we requested HP Administration to allow students to board colony Shuttle at 6 pm while going and leave at 8 pm while coming back.

On 28th July, we had 50 students who reported in Chumrey - from all three mediums of teaching (Hindi/English/Marathi) and from Class 1st to 12th. We streamlined our efforts

to handle such large variety of students and did gap analysis for identifying class-wise, medium-wise volunteers. Ankur, Sudhir and Shabbir took up the responsibility for managing the operations. Since, we used to commute to office in the same bus, we used that as an opportunity to keep aligning and fixing all the requirements related to the classes. Our responsibility ranged from scheduling the time table to availability of security guards for escorting kids to arranging the stationery to even bringing Good Knight for the classes. Since, it was a weekly class, the teacher who taught in the class used to share blackboard pic on the group. This ensured continuity of the topic during the next week.

During this time, we got another enthusiastic volunteer **Mrs**. **Priyanka Verma** who along with her husband **Mr**. **Nikhil Verma** and daughter **Ms**. **Niti Verma** played a pivotal role in commencing daily classes. Her family was the first family who took charge of conducting daily classes for Class 7. This instilled huge confidence in our team to move ahead for daily classes.

Finally, from October 2018, we took the much awaited plunge of taking daily classes with the support and commitment of our volunteers. We also released another circular in HPNE and HPNW colony to get more volunteers along with volunteers for extracurricular activities.

As we expanded, HP Admin provided us the much needed Infrastructure support in terms of providing benches for sitting, chairs for teachers, blackboard, RO for water etc. We started giving 2 awards for "Best Student of the month" and "Student with 100% attendance" in order to encourage students to be regular. Learning aids like Indian Map, World Map, Multiplication Table etc were included to make the teaching more interesting. We also framed basic guidelines for all the volunteers covering mandatory attendance of students, advance intimation of leave by any volunteer, arranging a back-up teacher in absence, signing teachers' attendance register, attending monthly meeting compulsorily etc.

Another enthusiastic volunteer **Mrs**. **Susan Saha** joined during September who led from the front to add class 9th in HPNE PATHSHALA. She took care of students like a mother right from them entering the premises till the time they reached home.



Our PATHSHALA had also got traction by our senior management and **Mr. J.S. Prasad** (ED-Pipelines) along with his wife joined us to teach class 9. Slowly our Class 9th team became strong with arrival of another key volunteer Mrs. Janaki Devi who not only volunteered for Class 9 but took care of Class 6th as well.

We were blessed to have volunteers like **Mrs**. **Rama T**, who worked selflessly every day to ensure smooth running of classes. She is at PATHSHALA from 6 to 8 pm almost everday and ensures that all the classes are conducted smoothly virtually forming the BACKBONE of HPNE PATHSHALA. After exit of Mrs. Avika Patel and Mrs. Resmy Sibbi, she took charge of both class 5 and 6 and is an example of commitment personified.

Finally, due to tremendous efforts of all the volunteers of PATHSHALA, we could successfully complete 2018 -19 academic session of both the teams.

It was a FULFILLING MOMENT for our entire PATHSHALA team when all the 5 students of Class 10th passed with all of them performing very well in English, Science and Maths.



- This was also one of the main reason for me and my husband to start Pathshala- To give kids capability and confidence for making a place for themselves in society based on merit and not on any other considerations. To be socially responsible and thus socially acceptable.
- One of my major focus was to ensure all round personality development of student ranging from public speaking to general awareness to etiquettes to social behavior.
- o The children were at the most aware of the world only till the boundaries of Mumbai. So, we used maps to introduce them to India as a country with all its states and UTs. Gave them list of all the states and UTs with their capital. Introduced them to the federal structure of the country.
- Held debate competitions on various social and contemporary issues to help them overcome their stage fear but also enabled them to invoke a thought process on the various issues that impact their life.
- o I always wanted to be a Quiz Master and these children provide me an opportunity to be that for them.
- The Kids' zeal to learn anything and everything that is taught to them motivates me to keep preparing something new for them.

o It gives me an extreme sense of satisfaction and happiness when the kids use these learnings in their day-to-day life and grow towards becoming a complete, socially responsible citizen.

What challenges I faced?

- o Being a working women with a six-year-old daughter when Pathshala started, managing office, home, daughter's studies and other requirements along with time for Pathshala was a daunting task.
- Setting up Pathshala and not letting it just be a fad required lots of time commitment and perseverance.
 We had to make people believe in its sustainability to get them on board. One of my major role in the process was to provide moral support to Ankur ensuring that he doesn't gives up. After all the challenges, it was a DREAM worth REALIZING.
- o The students that came to us had very limited knowledge of the world. They had rarely got an opportunity to express themselves through public speaking in school. Most importantly, for most of them the atmosphere at home was least encouraging- some staying with single mother or grand parents or a drunkard father and had with very limited means. Being socially responsible had no meaning for them. A TOUGH TASK FOR US TO DRIVE HOME THE SOCIAL VALUES...

How did I overcome above challenges?

- Through the much needed family support of my husband, my mother and especially my daughter enabled me to manage whatever classes and sessions, I took for Pathshala.
- o The Kid's faith in us and their willingness to adapt and learn helped us to build their social character.

- To bring the students at a level where each one could understand required few classes only for teaching the basics. Conducted the classes covering basics of maths for class 6/7/8.
- To understand the concerns and build confidence in parents, we visited nearby schools and addressed the parents in Marathi.

Sustainability of PATHSHALA



TEAM PATHSHALA is a unique platform that works on self-less voluntarism. We have evolved from a team of 6 volunteers to a team of 60 volunteers in last 18 months. Word 'TEAM' was kept intentionally before PATHSHALA to always remind each and every volunteer that we shall sustain if we work as a TEAM.

When we started, we did not have any broad structures for this initiative but over the time as we evolved, we made structures to sustain this social cause. We have a 'Leadership body' which drives the overall initiative viz. it includes volunteers who take care of liasoning with HP Admin, volunteers having capability to organise extracurricular activities for students and volunteers who can take future leadership position to drive this initiative. Next body is of class-wise 'Mentors' who are responsible for ensuring smooth running of classes. Mentors are also part of Leadership body so as to ensure faster decision and continuous feedback to improvise the efforts.

- Ensuring safety of students within Premises.
- Coordination with HP Admin Office for infrastructure support.
- Arranging Projector Training for the teachers.
- Organizing Parents Teacher Meet atleast once a month.
- Coordination with Corporate Affairs/HP Sampark team for arranging gifts, mementos etc.
- Arranging monthly meeting of Mentors and resolving problems faced by them.
- Fund Raising and overall management.
- Adding new volunteers in the team.
- Maintaining motivation level by introducing various volunteer centric intitiatives

CLASS MENTOR HAS THE FOLLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Will take care of overall academics and personality development of kids.
- Can advise extracurricular team to organize specific events for his/her class.
- Be in regular touch with his/her class teachers to get their feedbacks.
- Attend Mentors Meeting once a month and share his/her class experiences, their plan for scope of improvement.
- Getting support from leadership body as and when required.

Before rolling out this initiative we follow the below stated steps to ensure we lay a strong foundation of PATHSHALA.

1. Need assessment -

Before rolling out, meeting is conducted with the beneficiary community to understand the actual need. Need assessment form is given to them to submit their specific requirements like subject, medium of study etc.

2. Orientation cum Ice Breaking session -

This session aims at connecting with the children and understanding their level of understanding and actual need.

3. Time table -


Class-wise time table is prepared based on the requirements of students. We are currently focussing on Maths, English and Science but we also support in Social Studies, Marathi, Economics as and when required by students, basis the available resources.

4. Scheduling of classes -

Initially we commence weekend classes only. Once it stabilises we commence 3-4 days a week classes till we reach our goal of minimum 5 days a week classes for grade 5-8. Extra classes are conducted for senior students on Sat/Sun as well.

5. Class-wise groups -

Whatsapp groups are formed by Mentors for day to day coordination. Main group is used for information dissemination and decision making for various larger initiatives.


TANVI PRAVIN PATEL OF CLASS V
